## The Vodafone Dmax 2013 Championships

### Round 4 – 19<sup>th</sup> May 2013 – Rye House

The Vodafone Dmax Champs returned to Rye House Circuit for Round 4 of this years' championships. Last year's first ever visit to Rye House featured on-off rain throughout the day but this year, despite the forecast, 114 drivers enjoyed sunshine and a dry circuit for the entire day.

#### Heats

##### Heavy Heat 1

Jamie Pender (JP) got off to a good start and held the lead. He was followed by David Scott (DS), Ian Brooks (IB) and Ian Dutfield (ID). JP quickly built a lead as those behind battled for 2<sup>nd</sup>, leading by 4.043 seconds after the first 3 laps. Christ Carter (CC) had made his way into 4<sup>th</sup> and was just a few kart lengths back from DS and IB and gaining with the three of the separated by 0.386 seconds. Pender was putting in fastest lap after fastest lap and soon at a lead of 5.933 seconds with 5 laps left of the race to run. IB found a way past DS as CC found a way past the pair of them to move himself into 2<sup>nd</sup> with DS dropping to 4<sup>th</sup>. ID was holding onto 5<sup>th</sup>, just 1.118 seconds adrift of 4<sup>th</sup> with Simon Ross (SR) on his heels with SR passing ID for 5<sup>th</sup> on lap 8. He very quickly closed in on DS in 4<sup>th</sup> and passed him through the 2<sup>nd</sup> hairpin on the penultimate lap. JP was still putting in fastest laps with a 42.031 with one lap remaining, his lead now 8.832 seconds over CC. JP took the win ahead of CC with IB finishing 3<sup>rd</sup>, just 0.844 seconds behind. SR took 4<sup>th</sup> just ahead of DS.

## Light Heat 1

Johnny Spencer (JS) and Ben Leslie (BL) led the field away and were closely followed by Chris Hackworth (CH) in 3<sup>rd</sup>. This leading trio raced bumper to bumper through the opening lap with CH moving himself into 2<sup>nd</sup> ahead of BL through the first hairpin. This gave JS a couple of kart lengths of breathing space at the front, but CH was soon back with the leader. James Baldwin (JB) was making his way through the field as CH put in a fastest lap of 41.448 in his pursuit of JS. He got his man on lap 4, and proceeded to putting some distance between himself and the pair of JS and BL. JB had now moved up into 4<sup>th</sup> and was closing in on JS and BL as contact was made through the first hairpin. This allowed JB to slip past into 2<sup>nd</sup> as they slowed each other down at the exit of the corner and meant Steve Moody (SM) and Oliver Knighton (OK) were now right behind them. JB put in a fastest lap of 40.849 seconds as he closed in on CH but ran out of laps as CH took the chequered flag. JB took 2<sup>nd</sup> ahead of BL, JS and SM.

## Inters Heat 1

Mark Handyside (MH) led from Joe Holmes (JH) at the start, but the pair lost out to Alec Tucker (AT) on the opening lap as he took the lead. JH held onto 2<sup>nd</sup>, dropping MH to 3<sup>rd</sup> with MH losing another position to James Pratt (JP) a lap later. JP went one better on lap 3, taking 2<sup>nd</sup> and setting a fastest lap of 42.041 as he chased down AT at the front. He improved on his time with a 41.859 a lap later, reducing the gap to half a second. JP was relentless in his pursuit of AT and brought JH with him to make it a 3 way scrap for the lead. Dave Clarke (DC) had got himself into 4<sup>th</sup> some 4.6 seconds behind the leading trio and was holding off MH in 5<sup>th</sup>. JP drew alongside AT coming out of the chicane on lap 8 and got ahead under braking. JH added to AT's pain as he moved him down to 3<sup>rd</sup> half a lap later. JP

held onto win, 1.047 seconds ahead of JH in 2<sup>nd</sup>. AT was just behind him in 3<sup>rd</sup> with DC and MH rounding out the top 5.

## Heavy Heat 2

David Vincent (DV) got off to a good start moving from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 1<sup>st</sup> through turn 1, holding off Michael McKeegan (MM) behind him. Chris Munro (CM) moved into 3<sup>rd</sup> with Simon Ross (SR) and Robert Bennett (RB) in close company. DV proceeded to pull away at the front, building a lead of 2.099 seconds after the opening 3 laps with SR making his way up into 3<sup>rd</sup>. Chris Carter (CC) set the fastest lap of the race so far with a 42.664 seconds on lap 4. He had moved to within half a second of the battling pair of MM and SR with SR and CC getting ahead of MM through the left, right at Pylon. CC then went one better, taking 2<sup>nd</sup> from SR through turn 1. All of this allowed DV to get away at the front with him securing the win ahead of CC, setting the fastest lap on the penultimate lap with a 42.465. SR came home in 3<sup>rd</sup> ahead of MM and Salman Alkhater.

## Lights Heat 2

Dominic Tucker (DT) led the field as the green flag was waved and was followed by Ryan Ould (RO). Oliver Knighton (OK) was in 3<sup>rd</sup> as the first laps were completed and RO took the lead from DT on lap 2. Tom Longfield (TL) was into 4<sup>th</sup> and challenging for 3<sup>rd</sup>, getting ahead through the final sequence of corners on lap 3. Chris Hackworth (CH) was making up places and was being followed by James Baldwin (JB) with the pair in 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> respectively after 4 laps. CH soon moved up into 3<sup>rd</sup> behind RO and DT with half the race remaining as JB set a new fastest lap with a 41.819 and jumped TL and DT to move into 3<sup>rd</sup>. This soon became 2<sup>nd</sup> as RO was deposed by CH at the front and JB quickly moved passed too. CH finished ahead of JB by 0.498 to win heat 2. TL came home in 3<sup>rd</sup> with RO and DT completing the top 5.

## Inters Heat 2

Tim McKeegan (TM) took the lead through turn 1, dropping Gary Patterson (GP) to 2<sup>nd</sup>. Paul Crawford (PC) moved up into 3<sup>rd</sup> in the early stages and was closely followed by Jonathan Bowers (JB) and Stuart Foster (SF). TM had build a lead of 0.787 by lap 4 but GP was keeping him honest, not allowing him to get further away. PC was dropping back a bit, 2.547 adrift of the lead at the halfway stage. Joe Holmes (JH) had made his way up to 5<sup>th</sup> with 4 laps to go and was closing in on the pair of PC and SF ahead of him with a string of fastest laps. As TM started his final lap, the gap back to GP was down to 0.493 seconds. TM held his nerve however, and came home in 1<sup>st</sup> with GP having to settle for 2<sup>nd</sup>. PC took 3<sup>rd</sup> with JH snatching 4<sup>th</sup> from SF on the final lap, dropping SF to 5<sup>th</sup>.

## Heavy Heat 3

Fred Dones (FD) nudged Jack Dutfield (JD) wide through turn 1 to take the lead, only to spin at the first hairpin. This all benefitted Chris Carter (CC) who moved up into the lead, followed by JD and SR, who had moved up into 3<sup>rd</sup> over the opening laps. JD was soon on CC's tail with SR 1.598 seconds further back and Robert Bennett (RB) a further 0.858 seconds back in 4<sup>th</sup>. SR was putting in fastest lap after fastest lap, catching the leading pair by around half a second a lap and making it a three-way fight for the lead by the end of lap 6. JD sliced past CC through the 2<sup>nd</sup> hairpin with the move allowing SR to get onto the rear bumper of CC; 0.417 seconds covering the three of them as they crossed the line. SR got ahead of CC a lap later and was following in JD's wheel tracks as they entered the penultimate lap. JD held on though and took the chequered flag ahead of SR by 0.284 and CC. RB and Chris Munro completed the top 5.

Steve Moody (SM) added to EC's pain as he took 2<sup>nd</sup> from him. The leading pair quickly pulled away as a train began to form behind EC with Chris Hackworth (CH) right behind him. CH took 3<sup>rd</sup> on lap 3 and set about trying to catch SM who was 1.893 seconds up the road from him. JB was pulling away at the front and had a lead of 3.536 seconds at the halfway stage. CH had caught SM with SM seemingly allowing CH passed on the top straight. Gustavo Siveria (GS) had made steady progress through the field and was sitting in 4<sup>th</sup> with two laps to go with Oliver Knighton (OK) 1.612 seconds behind him. JB won heat 3 comfortably ahead of CH with SM in 3<sup>rd</sup>. GS took 4<sup>th</sup> and OK came home in 5<sup>th</sup>.

## Inters Heat 3

Andrew Knapp (AK) led the field around on the opening lap and was followed by Anthony Ford (AF) and James Pratt (JP). Gary Patterson was not far behind in 4<sup>th</sup> and putting in some quick times to join the three ahead of him that were now headed by AF, the leading 4 being separated by 0.986 seconds. JP was soon on the back of AK and outraked him going into the first hairpin, but AK came back at him immediately and regained the position. This was allowing AF to get away at the front and build a lead of 0.981 seconds after the first half. JP got ahead of AK again, this time through the chicane and made it stick, allowing him to break free of the pack and start chasing down AF. GP was now hassling AK for 3<sup>rd</sup> with the pair of them being joined by Jonathan Bowers (JB). JP could only match the leader's pace, meaning he was getting away from those behind him, but not gaining allowing AF a comfortable drive to the chequered flag to win and set the fastest lap on the final lap with a 41.495. JP had to settle for 2<sup>nd</sup> ahead of AK, GP and JB.

## Heavy Final

Chris Carter (CC) led from Simon Ross (SR) and David Vincent (DV) as Jack Dutfield got a poor start in 4<sup>th</sup> and had to defend early on. SR went for a move on lap 2 to take the lead, passing CC on the brakes at the hairpin, but ran wide

on the exit, allowing CC to get back past. CC set a new fastest lap on lap 3 with a 42.604, but was only 0.291 seconds ahead of SR as they crossed the line with DV a further 0.427 seconds back. JD lost out to Jamie Pender (JP) on lap 4 with JD losing a further position to Chris Munro (CM) through Pylon a lap later. Lap 6 saw SR repeat his attempted pass on CC for the lead with the same result off CC getting back ahead of SR as he ran wide. DV was just observing the action in front of him and was close enough to pick up the pieces should anything happen between the leaders. SR got ahead of CC through turn 1, but CC came back at SR through the hairpins, getting a better run into Pylon around the outside for the left hander, giving him the inside for the right hander. SR then tried a move on CC through the final corner, but contact was made, pushing CC wide allowing DV to get ahead of them both as SR waited to allow CC back through to avoid a penalty. DV was now under pressure from CC and SR with 5 laps left to run with CC getting back ahead through the right hander at Pylon, forcing DV wide and allowing SR to slip past to take 2<sup>nd</sup>. SR was back on CC's rear bumper, trying to find a way past, but time was running out. As they entered the final lap, 0.355 seconds separated CC and SR but CC held on to win ahead of SR and DV, 0.651 seconds separating the podium. CM and JP completed the top 5.

## Lights Final

Chris Hackworth (CH) held off James Baldwin (JB) at the start with Oliver Knighton (OK) slotting into 3<sup>rd</sup> behind them. CH and JB were soon away at the front building a lead of 1.032 seconds over OK in 3<sup>rd</sup>. Steve Moody (SM) soon took over from OK in 3<sup>rd</sup>, but OK came back at him with SM retaking 3<sup>rd</sup> again through the 2<sup>nd</sup> hairpin on lap 3. JB set a new fastest lap of a 41.650 on lap 4 compared to CH's 41.661, the pair too close to separate. SM was putting some distance between himself and Johnny Spencer (JS) behind him in 4<sup>th</sup> who in turn, was pulling away from Dominic Tucker (DT) and Ben Leslie (BL). At the halfway stage, CH started to put a couple of kart lengths between himself and JB, getting the lead up to 0.389 seconds; not much but just enough for JB to be out of striking range. With two laps left, JB caught back up to the back of CH and started to pressure him for the lead through the hairpins and into Pylon. CH was defending well though, not allowing JB a chance to get by and came home in 1<sup>st</sup>, 0.121 seconds clear of JB. 3<sup>rd</sup> went to SM with JS and BL finishing 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> respectively.

## Inters Final

James Pratt (JP) held off Joe Holmes (JH) as the green flag was waved, but lost out on the opening lap as JH moved into the lead. Tim McKeegan (TM) held onto 3<sup>rd</sup> at the start, but Anthony Ford (AF) and Jonathan Bowers (JB) slipped passed to take 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> respectively. JH was putting in a series of fastest laps and was pulling away from JP, his lead out to 1.345 seconds after 4 laps. JB got a better exit out of the final corner as they completed lap 4, allowing him to get a run into turn 1 and pass AF as they made their way around the long right hander. TM had his hands full with Dave Clarke (DC) and Gary Patterson (GP) as the three dived for 5<sup>th</sup>, just 0.6 between the three of them. JH set a new fastest lap on lap 7 with a 41.016, extending his lead to 2.167 seconds over JP, who was comfortably ahead of JB by 5.223 seconds in 3<sup>rd</sup>. DC got ahead of TM through the second hairpin, with the move slowly the pair of them up, allowing GP to get alongside DC down the back straight and up the inside through the right hander at Pylon to give him 5<sup>th</sup>. JH continued to pull away at the front and had a lead of 4.604 seconds by the time he was greeted with the chequered flag. JP had to settle for 2<sup>nd</sup>, 7.174 seconds ahead of JB in 3<sup>rd</sup>. AD and DC rounded out the top 5.
