## Light Heats

## Heat 1

Chris Hackworth started first in Heat 1 from Robert Moss, and the pair extended their lead quickly to pull away from the remaining 11 drivers. Ben Leslie received a penalty for his etiquette at the start (coming out of the tramlines before the start line), and then gained an advantage by contact over Richard Lacey at the end of the first lap. Chris Hackworth and James Baldwin were soon joined by Jonny Spencer, who was soon right on the bumper of James Baldwin, utilizing the slip stream off Baldwin's kart down the main straight and pulling out to attempt to take $2^{\text {nd }}$ up in to the first chicane; James Baldwin drove defensively and managed to hold his place for a few more corners. But by the time the pair were on the back straight, Jonny Spencer had seized $2^{\text {nd }}$, and set his sights on Chris Hackworth, setting the fastest lap of the race so far of a 1:08 dead and eating in to Chris Hackworth's 2.2 second lead. Dominic Tucker was just over a tenth of a second behind Robert Moss as the pair came down the main straight with 3 laps remaining, and behind them Ben James was similarly close to Kyle Jackson. Dominic Tucker made a move on Robert Moss and kept it to finish $8^{\text {th }}$. Chris Hackworth kept $1^{\text {st }}$ place despite Jonny Spencer's best efforts, and James Baldwin completed the top 3.

Heat 2
As the $2^{\text {nd }}$ heat got under way, Jonny Spencer made good progress down the hill at the top end of the circuit, as Richard Lacey was passed by Ben Leslie towards the end of the lap. Josh King then made a move on Richard Lacey around turn 6 to take $3^{\text {rd }}$, as Ben Leslie increased his lead by putting in a 1:09.5. But Jonny Spencer behind in $4^{\text {th }}$ set a 1:08.8, whilst making his way passed Richard Lacey to take $3^{\text {rd }}$. Ben James and Kyle Jackson were close further down the field, with Kyle Jackson racing just 4 tenths of a second behind Ben James. Dom Whiting down in $7^{\text {th }}$ went quicker than Jonny Spencer with a new fastest lap of 1:08.5, while he gained on Chris Hackworth, who then overtook Richard Lacey, and began closing in on James Baldwin in $4^{\text {th }}$. James Baldwin, who was particularly quick in this heat, got past Jonny Spencer, but did not manage to pull
away and Jonny Spencer was close behind him for the duration of the heat. Kamran Moussa-Zadeh was increasingly quicker as the race progressed, setting his personal best of a 1:10.6 on the final lap. Ben Leslie kept the lead almost the entire race after securing it early on, and he won from James Baldwin and Josh King

Heat 3

Jonny Spencer had another good start, while Chris Hackworth crashed in to turn 2 up the hill, which was deemed as a racing incident. Dom Whiting pulled away from Marco Coltelli, Jonny Spencer and Richard Lacey, who were bumper to bumper down the main straight. Meanwhile Chris Hackworth was recovering from his early incident and nicely out-braked Ben Leslie in to the top hairpin, and then he and James Baldwin simultaneously overtook Josh King in the $2^{\text {nd }}$ hairpin, one taking him from the outside, the other sneaking up the inside. Chris Hackworth was then back up to $2^{\text {nd }}$, as Robert Moss, Kamran Moussa-Zadeh, Ben James and Kyle Jackson were all close at the back, with Dominic Tucker bridging the gap between the front and back runners. Chris Hackworth finished $1^{\text {st }}$ from the back after his incident at the start of the heat, from Dom Whiting and Richard Lacey.

Final

Chris Hackworth led from Jonny Spencer. At the top of the hill, James Baldwin overtook Johnny Spencer, allowing Chris Hackworth to further his lead. But he then dropped back to $6^{\text {th }}$ as Dom Whiting, Jonny Spencer, Josh King and Ben Leslie got passed him. Jonny Spencer was back in to $2^{\text {nd }}$ and chasing down Chris Hackworth, setting a fastest time of 1:09.1 as he did so. Richard Lacey was successful in passing Ben Leslie under the bridge at the top of the circuit, and Marco Coltelli followed suit shortly after. Marco Coltelli ran wide out of turn 13 and on to the grass as he hoped to stick a similar move on Dominic Tucker. Chris Hackworth looked in great form, as he was only getting quicker with the clear air ahead of him, and gained a comfortable 3 second lead over Jonny Spencer. Further back, Kamran Moussa-Zadeh and Ben James were in a race of their own, just 4 tenths of a second apart while Dom Whiting up in $4^{\text {th }}$ ran wide and hit the kerb hard, losing himself a considerable amount of time. Chris Hackworth secured his deserved win, with Jonny Spencer, who had a good day of racing, in $2^{\text {nd }}$. Josh King finished $3^{\text {rd }}$ after also having a successful day.

## Inter Heats

## Heat 1

Alex Tucker started in pole for the Inter Heat 1, getting a good start as Xander Mahony and Dan Sibbons approached turn 5 side by side, joined by Dave Clarke at the exit. By the $2^{\text {nd }}$ lap, the group were still close. So close that 2 warnings for contact were issued in the lap, as James Brett-Pitt was forced out wide at the exit of turn 6. Dave Clarke momentarily secured the lead, but was soon deposed by Joe Holmes as the top 4 drivers remained within 7 tenths of a second for the middle portion of the heat. Andrew Knapp began to close up on the group, causing Anthony Kirk to full back slightly as he checked for potential lunges from Andrew Knapp. Dave Clarke in $3^{\text {rd }}$ set the quickest lap of the heat, a 1:09.0, as he surveyed the back of Alec Tucker, hoping for a try for $2^{\text {nd }}$, but he ran out of time as up ahead the chequered flag went down on Joe Holmes, from Alec Tucker.

Heat 2
James Pratt took second before the $2^{\text {nd }}$ corner from James Brett-Pitt on the opening lap. Kai Watson begun to make a small lead, but James Pratt behind him set the fastest lap as he set up his move on the back straight. He edged past Kai Watson at the exit of turn 5, as behind them Joe Holmes caught up to capitalize on the front pair's battle and took the lead up the inside in to the hairpin from turn 13. He then proceeded to pull away from Kai Watson, who in turn finally put a gap between himself and James Pratt. Behind the leading trio, Dan Sibbons and James Brunton were within 4 tenths of a second of each other, and less than a second behind the front 3 . Slightly further back, Dave Clarke was threatened by James Brett-Pitt for $9^{\text {th }}$ place, and overtaken cleanly just before the start/finish line. Xander Mahony was consistently quicker each lap, setting his personal faster towards the end of the heat, a 1:09.4. Joe Holmes managed to keep $1^{\text {st }}$ with

Kai Watson a safe distance behind him, while James Brunton took $3^{\text {rd }}$. James Pratt, whose race had looked set to promise a top 3 finish, ended in $7^{\text {th }}$.

Heat 3

There were several quick position changes in heat 3, as Joe Holmes took $1^{\text {st }}$ from Stuart Foster as soon as they were past the start line, while James Brunton and Allan Curtis overtook Andrew Knapp within the first lap. The group segmented, as the front two pulled away, then from $3^{\text {rd }}-8^{\text {th }}$ were all competing for position, as were the remaining 5. Xander Mahony passed James Brett-Pitt and was close on the back of Andrew Knapp with 4 laps gone. Joe Holmes and James Brunton further extended their lead, as James Brett-Pitt took back position for $9^{\text {th }}$ around turn 6. Joe Holmes and James Brunton were closer than ever as they manoeuvred turn 6 side by side, with Joe Holmes just holding James Brunton back as they continued down the straight. He held it until the chequered flag, with James Brunton right behind him and James Pratt 2 seconds behind them.

James Brunton dropped back slightly from $2^{\text {nd }}$ at the race start while Joe Holmes got away as the back of the pack grouped up. James Pratt and Alec Tucker both got past James Brunton while Kai Watson got past Andrew Knapp and into $5^{\text {th }}$ to chase down the front group. The entire group were within 5 seconds of the leader Joe Holmes, who himself was over a second ahead $2^{\text {nd }}$, so the racing was close across the whole field throughout. Xander Mahony got overtook by Dan Sibbons while a black flag was called on Dave Clarke for repeated late lunges resulting in advantage gained by side to side contact. Joe Holmes was then leading by over 2 seconds over James Pratt, who in turn had almost a second over Alec Tucker. Dave Clarke set the fastest lap of the race, 1:09.0 whilst failing to realise he was being called in for his penalty. He pitted for his penalty on the final lap as Joe Holmes crossed the finish line. James Pratt finished $2^{\text {nd }}$, with Alec Tucker coming $3^{\text {rd }}$ and Kai Watson just taking $4^{\text {th }}$ from James Brunton by 5 thousands of a second.

Ian Mcmillan was further pushed back at the entrance to turn 6, as George Dutfield cleanly manoeuvred up his inside.

## Heat 3

Up in front Rob Bennett got past David Vincent at turn 9 who was leading, and Rob Bennett defending his newly acquired position until the end of the heat. Tomasz Zaustowicz finished behind David Vincent and George Dutfield spun out at the bottom of the track on the last lap and finished 12.

## Final
