

# The TW Steel DMAX Champs 2014 – Round 9 – Daytona Milton Keynes

# Qualifying

A damp but drying circuit greeted the Light drivers for Round 9 of the 2014 TW Steel Dmax Championship which would make qualifying tricky with the drivers searching for the grip early on. James Baldwin was the early pacesetter with a 1:31.636 with Dom Whiting 0.201 seconds adrift in 2<sup>nd</sup> and Paul Cox sitting in 3<sup>rd</sup> a further 0.310 seconds behind. As the circuit continued to dry out and the drivers found the grip, the times began to tumble. Chris Hackworth hit the top of the timesheet with a 1:28.812 putting him 2.017 seconds clear of Whiting and Baldwin with Steve Moody and Ben Leslie now completing the provisional top 5. Whiting and Baldwin chipped away at Hackworth's advantage to be 0.699 seconds off with a minute of qualifying remaining, but Hackworth held on to take pole from Whiting, Baldwin, Kevin Drougzalet, Cox and Steve Moody.

#### Race

Chris Hackworth held the lead into a slippery turn 1 as James Baldwin got up the inside of Dom Whiting to take  $2^{nd}$  into turn 2 before just brushing the tyre wall on the outside of turn 3, but got away with it. Baldwin latched onto the back of Hackworth to complete lap 1 0.411 seconds behind him. Whiting was still sitting in







3<sup>rd</sup> looking to get back on terms with the leader with Paul Cox and Kevin Drougzalet hot on his heels. Baldwin grabbed the lead on lap 2 as the leading pair swapped positions coming down the back straight and through the hairpins of turns 10 and 11 with Baldwin now holding the advantage of 0.427 seconds after lap 2. Hackworth came back on the attack on lap 3 coming back up the hill, but Baldwin covered him off through the sweeping left hander at turn 9, but Hackworth got back ahead on lap 4 into the hairpin at turn 4 with Hackworth completing lap 4 ahead by 0.400 seconds. Baldwin was upping the pressure on Hackworth for the lead as the grip levels increased. Baldwin was on Hackworth's rear bumper coming up the hill down the back-straight and slid up the inside, but hit a greasy patch as the kart did a half spin, letting Hackworth easily regain the lead and Whiting taking 2<sup>nd</sup>. Baldwin regained 2<sup>nd</sup> a lap later but was now 2.525 seconds behind Hackworth after 10 minutes of racing.

Hackworth used the next 10 minutes to pull a gap of 6.642 seconds over Baldwin, setting several fastest laps on the way. Whiting was running in 3<sup>rd</sup> just half a second clear of Ben Leslie with Paul Cox 13 seconds adrift of this pair. Baldwin got his head down to start challenging Hackworth on pace, albeit 9 seconds back, as the pair continued to search out the grip in the now sunbathed track and traded fastest lap times. Leslie and Whiting also joined them in their competition for the fastest lap as Leslie made his way passed Whiting only to have Whiting regain 3<sup>rd</sup> on lap 24 and set a new fastest lap – the intense sun light quickly drying out the circuit with each passing lap.

Despite the consistent trading of lap times, Hackworth was gradually edging away from Baldwin leaving him a lonely 2<sup>nd</sup> as Whiting and Leslie continued to scrap over 3<sup>rd</sup>, 14 seconds behind him. A dry line began to appear around half of the circuit and some of the drivers began to capitalise, dropping their lap times dramatically as the race entered the final 10 minutes with Hackworth with the fastest lap - a 1:13.225 – but the lap times were improving by almost a second a lap, getting very close to a 'dry time'.

Hackworth took the win after an hour of racing, beating Baldwin to the chequered flag by 22.251 seconds with Dom Whiting completing the podium and Leslie and Moody rounding out the top 5.

# Inters

# Qualifying

A considerably drier track was presented to the Inters drivers with lap times immediately faster than anything the Lights could manage with Joe Ellis setting the early pace with a 1.08.923, 0.315 seconds clear of Bobby Trundley. This quickly changed however as Stuart Foster and then Andrew Tempest went quicker with 0.002 seconds separating them on the provisional front row. Trundley then came back only to have Joe Holmes top his time with a 1:07.945 to go 0.260 seconds clear of Trundley. Colin A Fox was sitting in 5<sup>th</sup>, 1.142 seconds off Holmes who had beat his time with a 1:07.547, extending his advantage over Trundley to 0.636 seconds only to then go 2 tenths quicker the following lap. Tempest split these two with 2 minutes remaining to take 2<sup>nd</sup> provisionally with a time 0.456 seconds off pole, only to have Stuart Foster and then Trundley edge him out by 0.061 seconds. Holmes ended his session 2 minutes early with a cushion of 0.395







seconds over the rest of the field as the chequered flag went out to signal the end of the session. Holmes took pole ahead of Trundley, heading him by 0.343 seconds. Foster lined up 3<sup>rd</sup>, 0.027 seconds behind Trundley with Tempest joining him on the 2<sup>nd</sup> row, a further 0.086 seconds behind. Tim McKeegan and Andrew Knapp qualified on the 3<sup>rd</sup> row another 0.039 seconds behind.

### Race

Joe Holmes led the field slowly out of the final corner at the start of the one hour endurance race with Bobby Trundley alongside him. As the green flag waved, Holmes held the lead into turn 1 ahead of Trundley with some of the pack going three abreast into turns two and three. Stuart Foster was right on the back of Trundley with Tempest and McKeegan in 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> respectively, as Holmes looked to build an early lead. Holmes was not hanging around, putting a string of fastest laps together to build a lead of 2.588 seconds after 5 laps as Trundley continued to be hounded by Foster with just 0.220 seconds between them. With Tempest and McKeegan catching the pair of Trundley and Foster ahead of them, Foster made his move to take 2<sup>nd</sup> as the two duos merged to form a quartet in the fight for 2<sup>nd</sup>. An error from Trundley on lap 9 saw him lose a further three positions to Tempest, McKeegan and Andrew Knapp. Trundley began to come back,







attacking Knapp into the hairpin at turn 10, only to have Knapp dive back down his inside at the final corner to regain 5<sup>th</sup>, but Trundley was not giving up, continuing to apply the pressure.

With 20 minutes completed, Trundley had got ahead of Knapp and had to be quick about it as a fast charging Joe Ellis was making his way through the field and eventually got ahead of Trundley to take 5<sup>th</sup> place from him and set his sights for Tempest, 4 seconds ahead of him. Holmes had been pulling away at the front by a few tenths on average to extend his lead to 8.502 seconds, but with Foster holding the fastest lap of the race with a 1:05.703 at the half way stage. Ellis in the meantime had reeled in Tempest and passed him for 4<sup>th</sup> on lap 28 with Trundley following him up to the back of Tempest and putting him under pressure for 5<sup>th</sup>.

Having despatched of Tempest, Ellis had set after McKeegan to get within 0.259 seconds behind him after 35 laps and was searching for a way past to try and steal 3<sup>rd</sup> as Knapp, Tempest and Trundley continued to scrap for 5<sup>th</sup>, swapping positions between themselves. Foster had been slowly reeling in Holmes at the front with 20 minutes of the race remaining – the gap down to 6.624 seconds – as Ellis finally found his way past McKeegan for 3<sup>rd</sup>. McKeegan was not taking it lying down however, repassing Ellis for 3<sup>rd</sup> through the final corners on lap 40 as the pair made their way through traffic. Ellis came back at McKeegan and passed him once more on lap 44 to take up 3<sup>rd</sup> and got his head down to start edging away from McKeegan. Knapp and Trundley were still separated by half a second and had dropped Tempest by 3 seconds who couldn't quite match the two ahead of him for pace. Trundley had snuck back past Knapp with Knapp trying to hold on around the outside of the final corner but Trundley kept him behind with a lap remaining.

Holmes took the win from Foster with a gap of only 5.411 seconds after an hour of racing between them as Ellis completed the podium a further 12 seconds behind with Holmes' win securing him the 2014 TW Steel DMAX Endurance Championship a round early. McKeegan came home in 4<sup>th</sup> and Trundley held off Knapp at the end to complete the top 5.

# **Heavies**

# Qualifying

With a practically dry track available to the Heavies for qualifying, it would be down to who could extract the most out of their kart rather than who found the grip in the fight for pole position. Chris Carter appeared to be the man pushing hardest, setting the early pace but was soon challenged by Jamie Pender and Michael McKeegan as both demoted him – Pender's time a 1:06.644 good enough for provisional pole by 0.335 seconds from McKeegan. Carter dug a little deeper to move into 2<sup>nd</sup>, 0.255 seconds adrift of Pender as







Tomasz Zaustowicz and David Vincent moved into 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> respectively. Pender extended his advantage to 0.300 seconds, only to have Carter bring it back down to two and a half tenths. Zaustowicz snuck into 2<sup>nd</sup> as Pender put in another fastest lap to go 0.408 seconds clear in provisional pole with 4 minutes remaining. The chequered flag ended the session with Pender taking pole on a 1:06.057 taking pole by 0.107 seconds from Zaustowicz. Carter would line up in 3<sup>rd</sup> a further 0.407 seconds behind. McKeegan would join Carter on the second row with David Vincent and Robert Bennett behind them.

#### Race

Jamie Pender got off to a good start from pole leading the pack on the opening lap as Tomasz Zaustowicz, Robert Bennett and Chris Carter all scrapped for 2<sup>nd</sup> around the final corner at the end of lap 1. Pender was quickly getting away but Zaustowicz held on to 2<sup>nd</sup> on lap 2, setting the fastest lap of the race to reel in Pender with Carter right behind him, beating Zaustowicz's fastest lap on lap 3. Pender, Zaustowicz and Carter were all separated by 1.5 seconds after 4 laps with a gap of 7 seconds back to Bennett in 4<sup>th</sup> and David Vincent in 5<sup>th</sup>.

The gap between the top three was coming down as they lapped bumper-to-bumper after 8 minutes of racing with Zaustowicz looking to get ahead with Carter just a kart length behind, waiting for Zaustowicz to make his move with lap 7 seeing Zaustowicz and Carter both set a time of 1:06.373. Zaustowicz picked his moment and passed Pender for the lead after 10 minutes of the race had passed and got his head down to start pulling a gap as Pender kept Carter just out of striking distance. Pender responded however to match Zaustowicz's pace, completing lap 12 just 0.001 seconds slower than Zaustowicz's time with Carter going 0.007 seconds quicker than the pair of them.







Lap 16 saw Carter climbing all over the back of Pender having just set the fastest lap on the lap before. As the pair made their way along the back straight and through the sweeping left hander at turn 9, Pender just misjudged his braking slightly, running half a metre wide at turn 10 and giving Carter a run into turn 11. Carter took the opportunity and lunged up the inside of Pender with Pender trying to hold on around the outside, but Carter kept up his momentum and had the inside for turn 1, giving him 2<sup>nd</sup> position and a shot at trying to catch Zaustowicz.

Bennett was running in a lonely 4<sup>th</sup> with Munro just as lonely in 5<sup>th</sup>, but David Vincent had Lee Witney all over his rear bumper in the battle for 6<sup>th</sup> as Zaustowicz continued to extend his lead over Carter who still had Pender following in his wheel tracks. Witney had passed Vincent for 6<sup>th</sup> with Michael McKeegan now lining up behind Vincent as Adam Daly and Graham Higgs looked as though they may be closing in some time soon. Carter was able to go after Zaustowicz without fear from behind at the halfway stage as Pender got caught out with a backmarker into turn 2 which dropped him to 2 seconds behind Carter and possibly costing him a chance to challenge for the win.

Zaustowicz appeared to be on a leisurely Sunday drive as he casually and gradually increased his lead over Carter to 6 seconds with 20 minutes of the race remaining and seemingly had everything under control. Pender was beginning to fall back from Carter as he now had 3.8 seconds to make up to Carter, but was crucially 29 seconds clear of Bennett in 4<sup>th</sup>.

As the time ticked away, Zaustowicz continued to steadily increase his advantage over Carter with Carter doing likewise over Pender in 3<sup>rd</sup>. Bennett was still sitting in 4<sup>th</sup> with Munro still 3.6 seconds behind him as the chequered flag was made ready. Zaustowicz won Round 9 of the TW Steel DMAX Endurance Championship, beating Carter to the line by 5.721 and stopped concentrating just enough to have a spin at turn 3 after the chequered flag. Pender completed the podium with Bennett and Munro rounding out the top 5.
