

The TW Steel Dmax 2015 Enduro Championships Round 5 – Daytona Milton Keynes – Cliff Circuit

Heavy Qualifying

With 17 drivers on the grid, the first endurance session to hit the track was the Heavy's qualifying. With Rob Bennett looking quick to begin with, the time to beat was a 1:12.1 as the tyres warmed to the Cliff circuit at Daytona Milton Keynes. Approaching the half-way mark, both Jamie Pender and Adrian Wisniewski enjoyed a stint at the top, with the quickest time of the latter dropping down to a 1:10.4. At 10 minutes in Andy Archer set his quickest time, as did David Vincent, while the top 3 were all covered by two tenths of a second. With two minutes to go before positions were determined, Adrian Wisniewski had found another half a second for pole and Chris Carter snuck in with a late 1:09.9 to take third for the impending hour's race. Rob Bennett qualified 2nd.

Race

Adrian Wisniewski kept 1st at the race start, defending from the pressure of Rob Bennett in to the first corner. Adam Daly experienced minor contact, and as the first lap finished, Chris Carter took Rob Bennett for 2nd, up the inside in to the last corner. Rob Bennett lucked out and lost a further 7 positions for not yielding in to turn 6, and it looked like his task was set for the race; a climb back up the grid over the next 55 minutes from his fall to 9th. While Rob Bennett was falling back, Chris Carter was conversely moving up the pack and took 1st up the inside in to turn 6. Rob Bennett had made it up to 7th and tried to stick a move on Tomasz Zaustowicz. Contact was made but Rob Bennett saved himself the penalty and conceded the place. This was the pattern of the next few laps, forcing Tomasz Zaustowicz to drive defensive.

At 21 minutes in, the pack began to spread out and settle in to position. Daljeet Bahia set his quickest time of a 1:10.8 at this point and was 3 tenths of a second behind Michael McKeegan in 10th. James Griffith had called in a day 17 laps in having changed karts, so we were down to 16 on track. Both Andy Archer and Parish were racing at the rear of the pack with Lee Witney, while higher up the grid Rob Bennett took 5th from Adam Daly. Between turns 8 to 10, Daljeet Bahia and Michael McKeegan had closed up and danced around each other to the end of the lap. Michael McKeegan just kept it and pulled just over half a second away as Daljeet cooled it off for the lap. Rob Bennett had by this point taken 4th at turn 4, around Gareth Holt, and had his sights set on the quick Jamie Pender for 3rd. And his sights certainly were set, as he went quickest of the race with a 1:08.9, taking 3rd down the start/finish straight the same lap. Rob Bennett was finally having some pressure from behind as Jamie Pender stuck within 3 tenths of a second for the next few laps, as the pair lapped Lee Witney over the start/finish. With just over 10 minutes remaining, Oliver Peacock







set his personal quickest time, as did Gary Mills, an impressive feat as he had Vinod Hirani just one tenth of a second behind him. Rob Bennett and Jamie Pender held each other up somewhat and it seemed Rob Bennett would not make up any more spaces, and was even under threat of losing the 3rd place he'd worked hard to regain, with just 8 minutes to go. While Rob Bennett had been fighting his way back up the field, Chris Carter had extended his lead over Adrian Wisniewski to a comfortable 6.6 seconds. Behind the top 4, Gareth Holt experienced a late offensive from Tomasz Zaustowicz, as the pair battled around the final corner for the penultimate lap. Chris Carter had clear air both in front and behind him as he took 1st place after the full hour, Adrian Wisniewski took a secure 2nd and Jamie Pender lunged around Rob Bennett up the inside at turn 11 at the approach to the finish line but Rob Bennett just caught him with less than a second to go! The disappointment was clear from Jamie Pender as he finished in 4th after a long fight for that final podium step.

Inter Qualifying

With a grid of 29 drivers, the Inter Enduro looked set to be a busy affair. Tim McKeegan was quick from the off, as were Joe Holmes and Ben Chapman, with the latter pair just one tenth of a second between each other at the mid-point of the preliminary session. Bobby Trundley found his pace by this point and made it to provisional pole with 5 minutes left, with a 1:08.8; Joe Holmes was just two tenths slower. Nuno Costa looked set for 3rd at this point, while the top 7 drivers all sat within a second of each other. Andrew Knapp made it up to 3rd in his final two laps, but Anthony Kirk went seven tenths of a second quicker on the final lap. Joe Holmes qualified 2nd from Bobby Trundley. Tim McKeegan who had been at the top to begin with was to start the race from 8th position.

Race

After a false start, the Inter Enduro got underway with Joe Holmes in 2nd keeping close to the tail of pole position Bobby Trundley. Further down the pack in 15th with Ben Oliver we had minor contact while the field found its place and settled in for the hour's race. Andrew Knapp in 3rd putting pressure on 2nd gave Bobby Trundley some momentary relief to pull away slightly, and after two laps he had a slightly more secure 1st with a half a second's lead. Alex Pritchard in 15th and Allan Curtis, in 16th, both went for the same track space at the approach to turn 11, with Allan Curtis allowing Alex Pritchard to go through, only to retake the place later the next lap. The first penalty black flag was awarded to Tim McKeegan for advantage by contact, as his bumper nudged the back of Luke Cousins down at turn 5, forcing him to run wide. A second black flag was given before the quarter way mark, as Adrian Hull went to go up the inside of Ben Chapman in to turn 4, locked up and made contact with Ben Chapman. Andrew Tempest had an incident and came off track in to the tyres, and pulled in to the pits to sensibly adjust his go-pro, and was released from the pits at the back of the pack. Andrew Tempest swiftly made it past newcomer Daniel Berrick for 26th, and began the task of eating in to 27th place Steven Hussey's 25 second gap.

Ben Chapman, Bruno Botelho and Ben Oliver took the start/finish straight and turn 1 3-abreast, with Ben Chapman emerging the victor in 8th. Up ahead of the battling trio was Anthony Kirk, who was three tenths of a second behind 6th placed debutant Nuno Costa as the drivers reached the 30-minute mark. Meanwhile up ahead Bobby Trundley had not only retained 1st place, but also held the quickest time up until that point, with 1:08 flat. Lower down the field Michael Coppin in 18th set his personal quickest; 1:10.7. By this point Andrew Knapp had made it past Joe Holmes for 2nd, but hadn't managed to put more than a second between them. Bobby Trundley, however, had managed to put eleven seconds worth of tarmac between himself and 2nd place. Meanwhile Louis Berrick avoided a penalty as he made contact with a lapping driver, but gave the place straight back with an apologetic gesture. Ben Oliver and Matthew Conroy also kept it clean as they took turn 9 together, racing well and leaving each other room, with the former just getting ahead for 10th. Luke Cousins passed Joe Holmes on lap 36, placing the pair just behind Andrew Knapp but comfortably ahead of Joseph Ellis in 5th. With 15 minutes remaining, Seb Cook took Simon Gibson for 17th, opening the door for Tom Eastwood in 19th to make a move. Behind him, Alex Del Verne was fighting to hold 20th as Tim McKeegan behind him was getting ever quicker. As the race entered the final stages, we had several small battles taking place on track. Stuart Shearman kept just over a second behind Matthew Conroy in 13th, as Antonio Caccioli and Chris Baister were just under a second apart; Blaze Sienko had a bit of track to himself down in 25th, with no one within ten seconds ahead or







behind him. Back to the front of the pack and Joe Holmes and Luke Cousins had lost a second to Andrew Knapp due to back-marker traffic.

Seven minutes remaining and Bobby Trundley began to encounter some traffic. While he kept his distance and was safely in 1st, Luke Cousins had caught up with Andrew Knapp and passed him, making it to 2^{nd.} Next was Joe Holmes' attack and he succeeded momentarily. Andrew Knapp came back passed but managed to take himself off at turn 10, allowing Joe Holmes back in to 3rd with 4 minutes to go. Allan Curtis and Ben Oliver had some close racing of their own, with Ben Oliver less than two tenths behind Allan Curtis who was fighting to keep 10th. Allan Curtis quickly managed to pull away before the last lap board, rapidly extending his lead to just over a second and securing the place. Someone else who's place was secure the entirety of the race was race leader Bobby Trundley, followed 13 seconds later by a deserved Luke Cousins in second, who'd recovered well the second half of the race after his earlier incident. Joe Holmes took 3rd; Andrew Knapp didn't manage to make back time after his mistake at turn 10 and took 4th after a tough race.

Light Qualifying

Chris Hackworth was off to a quick start, setting a 1:08.8 on the second lap, which was on par with the quickest qualifying time of the Inter session before. Chris Hackworth was soon usurped from top position by Dom Whiting, going just two tenths of a second quicker. Tom Golding, Ben Leslie, Jake Butler and Jason Cleveley were all within a second of Dom Whiting's time at this point however, so it was still early days. With just 5 minutes remaining the top 6 drivers' quickest times were all in the 1:08's, and Tom Golding was now at the top of the changing grid, with the quickest time of the day to that point; 1:07.9. The potential front two rows of drivers were separated by just two tenths of a second, and with a minute left to get their quickest laps in, Tom Golding was still the one to beat. As he came over the line and under the chequered flag, he set an even quicker 1:07.7, securing 1st place for the race. Chris Hackworth also set his best on the last lap and took 2nd, with Dom Whiting taking 3rd.

Race

Tom Golding kept his position at the start of the race, and as the field crossed the line at the end of the first lap, Dom Whiting had gained on Chris Hackworth and taken 2nd. The top three remained tight and began to pull away from Jake Butler in 4th. Further back David Glover and Mez Evans headed up another tight group and passed Jane Gibbons together down the straight at the end of lap 4. Dom Whiting set the quickest time on this lap, as both he and Tom Golding in 1st received warnings for bumping, indicating that there was pressure at the front. Tom Golding then lost 1st as he was taken on the inside in to turn 6, and lost out further, demoting himself to 3rd by coming off track at the Cliff Top end of the circuit.

A third of the way through the race, Andrew Ward in 20th set his personal quickest lap of a 1:10.3, as did Tanzi Besant in 17th with a 1:10.1. Tom Kempynck was close behind Joseph Conroy at this stage, and kept up with him until he took him on the 23rd lap, quickly putting some distance between them, speeding up to try and catch Jake Butler 8 seconds up the track. Jane Gibbons and Sam Bennett sandwiched Ben Leslie, both within two tenths of a second in front and behind him. Ben Leslie kept up his pursuit of Jane Gibbons while simultaneously fending off a persistent Sam Bennett, even managing to set his personal best time of 1:08.5. Just ahead of them on the 1200m circuit, Tom Sibley was pulling away from Mez Evans in an attempt to join the front runners. The pack, backed by Joseph Conroy were 4 seconds ahead. Meanwhile newcomer Steve Hannon set his quickest time of 1:09.3, bringing him within a second and a half of the quickest time of the session.

As the race entered its final 20 minutes, Dom Whiting had put 4 seconds between himself and 2nd place Tom Golding who was now under pressure from Chris Hackworth. Chris Hackworth did then take 2nd from Tom Golding in a nice manoeuvre, up the inside at the fast turn 10. Tom Golding remained close behind and pursued Chris Hackworth for subsequent laps. By lap 40 Ben Leslie and Jane Gibbons were side by side over the line, as Sam Bennett overtook Tom Clark. Steve Hannon and Nikolay Angelov were close in 15th and 16th, and Nigel Foot and Alan Scarr behind them kept consistent times and raced cleanly. With 8 minutes left, there wasn't too much activity at the front, although Tom Golding was still chasing Chris Hackworth. With 5 minutes remaining, the pair took the first turn side by side, with neither seemingly yielding. Tom Golding came to within four hundredths of a second, and the next time at the exit of turn 1, Tom Golding had back off slightly. Tom Golding didn't come across the same opportunity again and stayed, and finished in 3rd. Chris Hackworth held him off despite constant pressure and Dom Whiting, who'd led from early on, secured 1st place. Ben Leslie, David Glover, Jane Gibbons and Sam Bennett all crossed the line almost simultaneously, in 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th respectively.
