

# The TW Steel Dmax 2015 Heats Championships Round 8 – Clay Pigeon Kart Raceway

## **Heavy Heat 1**

Tomasz Zaustowicz grabbed the lead into turn 1 at the start with Ben Etchells losing out and dropping to 2<sup>nd</sup>. Jamie Pender was onto the back of them in 3<sup>rd</sup> and moved into 2<sup>nd</sup> into turn 1 on lap 2. Adrian Wisniewski followed into 3<sup>rd</sup> with Carter slotting into 4<sup>th</sup>. Zaustowicz was trying to break away at the front as Pender came under pressure from Wisniewski and Carter with Carter quickly moving ahead of Wisniewski to take 3<sup>rd</sup>. A full course yellow came out to deal with Bill Taylor going off the circuit with Zaustowicz losing some of his lead. The incident was dealt with and a lap later the green flags waved to resume racing. Carter was on the back of Pender looking for 2<sup>nd</sup> place as Zaustowicz once again began to build up his lead stringing together some fastest laps to open up the gap. Carter moved into 2<sup>nd</sup>, but Pender was back on his rear bumper, pushing to regain the position. Zaustowicz cruised across the line to win the first heat of the day from Carter, Pender, Wisniewski and Foster.

#### **Inters Heat 1**

Inter heat 1 got underway with an incident at turn 1 with a full course yellow coming out for a lap as Chris McCarthy went around and left nowhere for anyone else to go. Greens got the racing back underway with Joseph Ellis, Chris Alcock and Simon Joannou heading the field. Bobby Trundley was up into 4<sup>th</sup> and was on Joannou's case, taking 3<sup>rd</sup> under braking into turn 1. Ellis got his head down at the front to pull away from Alcock who had his hands full with Trundley directly behind him. Alcock was not going to let Trundley through easily as they lapped side-by-side for nearly an entire lap. Trundley had to settle for 3<sup>rd</sup> for another couple of laps as he piled on the pressure. Ellis was comfortably getting away at the front as Trundley finally got ahead at the hairpin on lap 10. Luke Cousins had been making steady progress up into 4<sup>th</sup> as Trundley dropped back behind Alcock who claimed 2<sup>nd</sup>. Trundley had to settle for 3<sup>rd</sup> ahead of Cousins and Joannou.

## **Lights Heat 1**

Newcomer Terrance Kavanagh lost out to Chris Hackworth at the start with Ben Leslie making his way into 2<sup>nd</sup>. Tom Golding was sitting in 3<sup>rd</sup> by the end of lap 1 with the three of them breaking away from the fight for 4<sup>th</sup> between Richard Lacey and George Hucknall. Hackworth was making his escape at the front as Golding started his attack on Leslie. Leslie however had the widest DMAX kart in the fleet as he kept Golding at bay despite him being tucked up under Leslie's exhaust. Golding finally found his way through into the hairpin on lap 6. During their squabble, Lacey and Hucknall had caught up and brought Simon Bryant and Bobby Dawes with him. Golding set a new fastest lap of the race as he chased down Hackworth at the front, but with a handful of laps remaining and a 4.2 second gap, it was going to be a tall ask. Hackworth took the win from Golding by 3.6 seconds with Lacey, Leslie and Hucknall completing the top 5.

#### **Heavy Heat 2**

After multiple restarts, Rob Bennett finally led the field away from pole with Stuart Foster moving up into 2<sup>nd</sup>. Paul King had a good opening lap to move himself into 3<sup>rd</sup> as Peter Gillett dropped down to 4<sup>th</sup>. Carter was making his way through the field to take 4<sup>th</sup> from King on lap 2 and began to look for a way past King choosing a move up the inside into the horseshoe as his place to pass for 3<sup>rd</sup>. Bennett was slowly edging away from Foster as Carter set a fastest lap in clear air as he chased down Foster. Another fastest lap saw him get the gap down to 8 tenths on lap 4 as Bennett extended his lead out front to 1.267 seconds. Tomasz Zaustowicz had moved into 3<sup>rd</sup> having started at the back of the grid with Jamie Pender seemingly glued to his rear bumper as they lapped together. Zaustowicz was passed King by the time they exited the chicane on lap 9 with Pender getting ahead under braking into the hairpin and then getting back onto Zaustowicz's rear bumper. Carter was into 2<sup>nd</sup> with a robust move up the inside of Foster into the horseshoe and set after Bennett at the front. The gap was coming down but time was running out. Bennett took the win by 0.318 seconds from Carter, Foster, Zaustowicz and Pender.

#### **Inters Heat 2**

Blaze Sienko held the lead at the start, but dropped to 2<sup>nd</sup> behind Luke Cousins by the time the field reach the horseshoe. Joseph Ellis had a good second lap to go from 5<sup>th</sup> to 2<sup>nd</sup> ahead of Chris Alcock, Chris McCarthy and Bobby Trundley. Cousins was pushing at the front, but Ellis was matching him for pace as Trundley set a new fastest lap in 4<sup>th</sup>. Ellis improved on Trundley's time a lap later to bring the gap to Cousins down by half a second to just 0.382 seconds with Alcock and Trundley just a kart length behind. Alcock was next to produce the fastest lap as the top 4 began to bunch up and leave McCarthy behind. Lap 7 saw Trundley move from 4<sup>th</sup> to the lead as things at the front got a little heated with Ellis now giving chase to Trundley and trying to shake off Cousins and Alcock. With clear air at the front Trundley set a new fastest lap to break away from the chasing pack with a handful of laps remaining. A series of fastest laps saw Trundley extend his lead to 1.7 seconds as







the 'Last Lap' board was given out. Trundley took the win ahead of Ellis, Cousins, Alcock and Allan Curtis.

## **Lights Heat 2**

Lee Walsh made a tidy start from pole, but lost out to Richard Lacey on the exit of the corner as the rest of the field gave chase. Tom Golding was into 2<sup>nd</sup> by the end of the opening lap with Ben Leslie and Peterson Lim also bettering their positions. Chris Hackworth had started at the back but was making quick work through the field to take 5<sup>th</sup> by the end of lap 2. Lacey was pacing himself at the front but Golding, Hackworth, Leslie and Lim were reeling him in with Hackworth setting several fastest laps in a row to put himself on Golding's rear bumper. Golding went for a move on Lacey into the horseshoe, but made contact and lost out to Hackworth on the exit as Hackworth moved into 2<sup>nd</sup> and onto the back of Lacey. Lacey was defending the inside line through most of the corners to see off Hackworth, but a run out of the final corner got him in front before the braking zone into turn 1. Hackworth then broke away to leave Lacey with Golding as Leslie took advantage of their fight through the final corner to move into 2<sup>nd</sup> with 2 laps to go. Hackworth took the win by 1.980 seconds from Leslie, Golding, Lim and Lacey.

### **Heavy Heat 3**

Elliot Taylor held off Chris Carter at the start with Carter going up the inside into the hairpin on lap 1 to take the lead. Lee Witney held 3<sup>rd</sup> with Tomasz Zaustowicz climbing over the back of him. Zaustowicz quickly moved his way into 2<sup>nd</sup> to head Taylor and Paul King as he gave chase to Carter at the front, setting a new fastest lap in the process to take the gap down to 0.623 seconds on lap 2. Another fastest lap on the following lap saw Zaustowicz take another tenth out of Carter's advantage as he got into Carter's tow. Adrian Wisniewski was on a charge, moving into 3<sup>rd</sup> ahead of Taylor, Rob Bennett, Jamie Pender and Stuart Foster. Carter and Zaustowicz continued to gap the chasing pack as Bennett got onto the back of Wisniewski with Pender on his rear bumper as they fought over 3<sup>rd</sup>. Their fighting allowed Foster to join in as Bennett got through at the penultimate corner to take up 3<sup>rd</sup>. Despite having closed down Carter quickly, Zaustowicz was unable to pass as Carter kept him at arm's reach to lead him across the finish line by 0.365 seconds. Bennett came home in 3<sup>rd</sup> ahead of Wisniewski and Pender.

Bobby Trundley took the lead at the start going around the outside of Simon Joannou at turn 1. Joannou lost out further to Joseph Ellis and Allan Curtis on the opening lap to drop down to 4<sup>th</sup>. Trundley was not going to hang around, opening up a gap over nearly a second after two laps as Ellis and Curtis left Joannou behind. Johnathan Purton was looking comfortable in 5<sup>th</sup> but Slawomir Piskorz, Chris Alcock and Luke Cousins were close behind with Cousins making good progress. Trundley was getting away at the front, extending his lead with each lap as Ellis kept Curtis just out of striking distance with the pair of them matching times. Trundley took a comfortable win from Ellis, Curtis, Joannou and Piskorz.

# **Lights Heat 3**

George Hucknall got away from pole leading Bobby Dawes with Chris Hackworth picking up a penalty for advantage by contact at the start. Hucknall was getting away at the front in the opening laps, but Dawes closed him down on lap 3 as Peterson Lim set his sights on closing down the leaders. Simon Bryant and Richard Lacey were 2.7 seconds behind Lim fighting over 4<sup>th</sup> with nothing between the pair of them until Lacey had a spin at turn 1. Tom Golding was moving his way up the order to sit in 5<sup>th</sup> on lap 5 with a new fastest lap of the race with Bryant next to come under pressure from Golding. A run out of the final corner nearly saw him through at turn 1, but as the bunch of Bryant, Golding, Andrew Hunt, Ben Leslie and Cameron Rodger all closed up, Golding was through at the horseshoe and put some distance between himself and those behind. Hucknall had opened up a lead of 0.6 seconds at the front as Lim caught Dawes for 2<sup>nd</sup>, but was struggling to find a way through. Hucknall took the win leading home Dawes, Lim, Golding and Leslie.

# Finals Heavies

Chris Carter and Tomasz Zaustowicz made a clean getaway from the first row to lead in  $\mathbf{1}^{st}$  and  $\mathbf{2}^{nd}$ respectively. Rob Bennett held 3<sup>rd</sup> with Jamie Pender on his rear bumper. Foster was 4 tenths back in 5<sup>th</sup> as Carter began to put in the quick laps he needed to start building a gap as Pender moved ahead of Bennett at the final corner to take 3<sup>rd</sup>. Zaustowicz and Pender responded to Carter's pace on lap 4 with both lapping Clay Pigeon Raceway faster than him. Zaustowicz was nearly within attacking range of Carter but would not want a repeat of the Sandown Park Round where he came together with Carter. Pender popped in a 40.326 to set a new fastest lap and joined them at the front as they all bunched up through turn 1 and the chicane and bogged down. This allowed Bennett to close as well and get a run with Pender taking the lead from Bennett, Carter and Zaustowicz with Foster also onto the back of the pack. Carter got a run out of the final corner on lap 9 to pass Bennett into turn 1 at the start of lap 10. Pender was away at the front with a lead of 1.4 seconds on lap 10 as Carter pushed to close down the gap. Zaustowicz moved back into 3<sup>rd</sup>, ahead of Bennett with Foster nearly close enough to make a move on Bennett. Zaustowicz set another fastest lap to edge towards Carter once more with an even faster lap being produced a lap later on lap 12 – a 40.152. Pender was only losing a tenth to Carter each lap with not long left to run with Carter more likely to come under attack from Zaustowicz than trying to pass Pender. Bennett could not keep up with the pace of Zaustowicz and Carter as he dropped back, but was managing to keep Foster at a distance. Pender held on to claim the win with Carter having to settle for 2<sup>nd</sup>. Zaustowicz completed the podium ahead of Bennett with Foster rounding out the top 5.

#### Inters

Bobby Trundley made pole count, leading the field out of turn 1, but ran wide at the hairpin to fall behind Joseph Ellis, Chris Alcock and Simon Joannou. Trundley was back into 3<sup>rd</sup> on lap 2 coming out of the chicane as Joannou now came under attack from Luke Cousins, Allan Curtis, James Bentley and Slawomir Piskorz. Ellis was making the most of it to pull away at the front, opening up a lead of 1 second after two laps. Alcock, Trundley and Cousins all responded however, by lapping faster than him on lap 3 with Cousins posting the fastest lap. The gap came down further a lap later with 0.752 seconds between Ellis and Alcock and Trundley began to attack Alcock for 2<sup>nd</sup>. A late lunge on the brakes into the hairpin on lap 6 saw Trundley through into 2<sup>nd</sup> as he now set after Ellis at the front. Cousins posted a new fastest lap - a 39.882 - to decrease the gap to Alcock with Alcock latching onto the back of Trundley as they both tried to chase down Ellis. Cousins moved himself into 3<sup>rd</sup> on lap 9 with a move on Alcock through the chicane. Trundley had the lead down to 0.349 seconds after 9 laps, but a small mistake on lap 10 at the hairpin saw him lose valuable time as the time remaining ticked away. Allan Curtis was running in a lonely 5<sup>th</sup> as the front four disappeared and Joannou held off Slawomir Piskorz and James Bentley. Ellis began to look behind him to see where Trundley was with Trundley just 0.199 seconds behind with Cousins just 0.355 behind Trundley. Trundley went for a move into the hairpin on lap 15, but didn't make it stick and with Cousins capitalising to move into 2<sup>nd</sup> into the horseshoe. On the final lap, as Cousins and Trundley entered the chicane, Cousins appeared to lose power with Trundley slipping back through into 2<sup>nd</sup>. Ellis took the win ahead of Trundley, followed by Alcock, Curtis and Joannou. Marshals on circuit managed to get Cousins up and running to limp home in 9<sup>th</sup> place.

# Lights

Hackworth immediately put the pressure on Golding through the hairpin and the horseshoe as Ben Leslie moved into 3<sup>rd</sup>. George Hucknall lost out at the start as he went from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> with Hackworth on the back of Golding into turn 1. Golding went defensive and a small nudge from







Hackworth was all that was needed to see Hackworth through and into the lead as Golding went wide. Hackworth was deemed to have gained an advantage through contact and was black flagged for the offence. Golding moved into the lead but was under intense pressure from Hucknall with Leslie just a kart length behind and Bobby Dawes on the rear of Leslie. Golding was still defending into turn 1 with the pack closing up behind to form a five kart train with Richard Lacey and Cameron Rodger looking to soon join in. A run out of the chicane saw Ben Leslie through into 2<sup>nd</sup> at the hairpin with Hucknall also losing out to Dawes, Peterson Lim, Lacey and Rodger. The move gave Golding some breathing space as Dawes now put Leslie under pressure for 2<sup>nd</sup>. Those at the back of this train began to lose touch with the leaders as they fought amongst themselves with Lim now into 4<sup>th</sup> ahead of Lacey and Hucknall. Golding was holding a cushion of 1.3 seconds over Leslie with 3 laps remaining and was gradually increasing his advantage with Leslie now clear of Dawes in a comfortable 3<sup>rd</sup>. Lim was holding onto 4<sup>th</sup>, but Lacey was not far behind with Hucknall, Rodger and Simon Bryant in close company. Golding cruised across the finish line to head home Leslie with Dawes coming home in 3<sup>rd</sup> to claim a maiden podium on his TW Steel DMAX debut. Lim finished 4<sup>th</sup> with Lacey completing the top 5.
