Light Heat 1

Josh Lad held the lead at the start, but local expert Jake Butler was into the lead by the time the field entered turn 1 with Matthew Bees, Michael Tillett and Max O'Shaughnessy all lined up behind him. Butler got his head down to start opening a gap leaving Bees to hold off O'Shaughnessy, Joshua Craft, Khan, Joe Conroy, Tom Golding and Cameron Noble. The trio of Bees, O'Shaughnessy and Craft began to break away from the rest of the pack, but Tillett responded to close the gap back up, bringing Conroy and Golding with him as Butler continued to extend his advantage. Craft grabbed 3rd with a move up the inside into 4, but O'Shaughnessy got the cut-back to retake the place into turn 5, giving Bees some breathing space and allowing Tillett and company to get involved in the action. Butler had no such dramas, disappearing up the road as the chequered flag was readied. Craft had progressed into 2nd with Golding into 3rd in the dying moments of the race as Butler took the first heat win ahead of Craft, Golding, Kameron Khan and O'Shaughnessy.

Matthew Conroy got the jump at the start to lead the field through turns 1 and 2 with Luke Austin tucking in behind in 2nd. Richard Lacey was into 3rd with Bobby Trundle up to 4th by the time the field completed lap 1. Lacey moved into 2nd on lap 2 as Conroy began to get away with Trundle into 3rd, passing Austin under braking for turn 4. Luke Cousins had moved up into 5th and was next to put

Austin under pressure as Trundley continued his rise through the field to take 2nd from Lacey on lap 3 whilst setting a new fastest lap. He was onto the back of Conroy by the end of lap 4 and got a run out of the final corner to pass him for the lead into the fast, flowing turn 1. Lee Hollywood had popped into 4th ahead of Austin with Cousins still nipping at his heels. Lacey was crawling over the back of Conroy's kart for 2nd as Hollywood closed in on the pair of them with a new fastest lap. Lacey grabbed 2nd on lap 6 with a lunge up the inside into turn 2 and Hollywood followed through and then passed Lacey for 2nd into turn 6. Hollywood was pushing to close the gap to Trundley, but time was running out to close the 1.4 second gap. Trundley won heat 1 ahead of Hollywood, Lacey, Cousins and Conroy.

Vinod Hirani held the lead through turn 1 with Chris Carter tucking in directly behind him to move into 2nd. By turn 3, Carter had progressed to the lead with Jamie Pender giving chase by the end of lap 1 as Hirani dropped to 3rd with Rob Bennett hot on his heels. Bennett move into 3rd and set his sights on catching the two in front as Stuart Foster was next to pass Hirani as he took up 4th spot. Carter was gradually extending his advantage at the front as Bennett zeroed in on Pender. Carter was pumping in fastest laps, but was only pulling a tenth a lap as the top 5 lapped to within a few hundredths of each other. Tomasz Zaustowicz pumped in a fastest lap with a lap to go, but the spoils went to Carter as he won from Bennett, Pender, Foster and Chris Munro.

Dillon Parmar got swallowed up at the start as Joseph Conroy hit the front into turn 1. He was chased along by Max O'Shaughnessy and Adam Blair by the end of lap 1 with Cameron Rodger and Michael Tillett not far behind. O'Shaughnessy gapped Blair and set after Conroy, leaving Blair with his hands full of Tillett and Rodger with Tillett sneaking through at turn 6 on lap 3 and Rodger through into turn 2 on lap 4. The top three were all lapping in 46.5 seconds at the halfway stage, making it difficult to close the gaps up as Tom Sibley, Tom Golding and Jake Butler found themselves together on the track in 6th, 7th and 8th respectively with Butler now setting a new fastest lap. Tillett bettered Butler's effort to claim fastest lap on lap 6, allowing him to get onto the back of O'Shaughnessy for 2nd as Sibley and Golding worked their way passed Rodger for 5th and 6th. Conroy was stretching his lead at the front, pulling two to three tenths a lap over O'Shaughnessy as he fended off a determined Tillett. Butler reclaimed the honour of fastest lap with two laps to go as Conroy took the win from O'Shaughnessy and Tillett with Blair and Sibley completing the top 5.

Jonathan Purton led the field away as the green flag waved, but quickly lost out as Matthew Gill, Chris Alcock and Lee Hollywood took up the top three positions by the end of the opening lap. David Cottrell was keeping them honest and moved into 2nd as the field headed through Vale, but Hollywood took the lead with the use of contact and was given a penalty. Alcock had dropped to 4th and had Luke Austin and Bobby Trundley tucked up behind him, following in his wheel tracks. Hollywood peeled off into the pitlane, handing the lead to Cottrell with Gill moving into 2nd ahead of Alcock, Trundley, Austin and Richard Lacey. A move under braking into turn 6 saw Trundley passed Gill for 3rd as Alcock moved into 2nd and set a new fastest lap. 2nd didn't last for long however as Trundley grabbed the position on the penultimate lap and bettered Alcock's fastest lap efforts. Cottrell started the final lap with a 1.244 second lead and held on to win by 0.789 seconds from Trundley, Alcock, Austin and Gill.

Lee Witney held the lead at the start as Chris Carter ended up pointing the wrong way at turn 2. Witney completed lap 1 with 0.328 seconds between himself and Jamie Pender with these two leaving behind Malcolm Clark, Vinod Hirani, Rob Bennett, Stuart Foster, Tomasz Zaustowicz, the recovering Carter and Alexander Mahony all lapping line astern. Pender lined up Witney through turn 5 and passed him onto the Top Straight to take the lead with Witney tucking in behind and taking his turn to apply the pressure rather than receive it. Clark was still holding onto 3rd as he and Foster pulled a kart length over Bennett and Carter with Carter stringing together some fastest laps. Foster moved into 3rd on lap 7 with Bennett, Carter and Zaustowicz following him through to drop Clark right down the order. Carter had muscled his way into 3rd on the penultimate lap, leaving Bennett, Foster and Zaustowicz squabbling behind him giving him some breathing space. Pender held on to claim the win with Witney tucked under his exhaust. Carter grabbed 3rd with Foster and Zaustowicz rounding out the top 5.

Dane Christison led the pack into turn 1 as they disappeared from sight, but it was Cameron Noble who emerged in the lead as they reappeared due to some drivers coming together. Michael Tillett grabbed the lead on lap 2 and was eager to pull away as he put some daylight between himself and Noble with Jake Butler now putting Noble under immense pressure. Joseph Conroy, Kameron Khan, Tom Golding and Joshua Craft were all next in line to have a go at 2nd place, but it was Butler that slipped through on lap 4. Sibley pumped in a new fastest lap on lap 5 from 10th place as he rose through the field and reeled in Craft with Craft now behind Max O'Shaughnessy as Dillon Parmar served a penalty. Sibley continued to put in the fastest laps to edge closer to Craft as Golding lunged Conroy into 6 for 4th and allowed those behind to bunch up further. Tillett received the 'last lap' board with a 2.6 second lead and a lap later took the win from Butler, Golding, Noble and Conroy.

Simon Gibson held the lead at the start despite those behind crawling all over the rear of his kart. Lee Hollywood had the best opening lap, moving up from 5th to 2nd and was immediately putting Gibson under pressure for the lead. Bobby Trundley had moved into 3rd by lap 2 which then became 2nd as he passed Hollywood through turns 6,7 and 8. These gave Gibson some breathing space for a lap, but Trundley was a man on a mission and closed the gap before taking the lead through turns 1 and 2 on lap 4. Hollywood quickly followed through to take 2nd and gave chase to Trundley with a new fastest lap. Trundley responded with a fastest lap of his own, some 3 tenths quicker to start opening up a lead as Gibson dropped back in 3rd with Giles Handley and Tom Eastwood just a kart length behind. Hollywood bettered Trundley's fastest lap by a tenth to get the gap down to 6th tenths and closed further on the following lap with a 45.909 comfortably earning him the fastest lap. A move through turn 5 saw Hollywood briefly take the lead, but he ran wide at turn 6 allowing Trundley to sneak back through. Trundley was now on the defensive as these two continued to pull away from the fight for 3rd between Gibson, Handley, Eastwood, Richard Lacey and David Cottrell. Trundley was under immense pressure on the final lap, but kept his cool and took the win by 0.179 seconds from Hollywood. Gibson, Lacey and Handley completed the top 5.

Malcolm Clark held the lead despite Rob Bennett's best efforts as he slotted into 2nd. Stuart Foster was into 3rd through turn 4 but lost out as Tomasz Zaustowicz and Jamie Pender snuck by through the final three corners. Bennett was into the lead on lap 2 with Zaustowicz into 2nd through turn 6 as Clark dropped to 3rd ahead of Pender. Chris Carter moved into 5th through turn 1 on lap 3 and set after Pender one second up the road. Zaustowicz hit the front on lap 3 and set a new fastest lap in the process as Bennett now had Clark and Pender shadowing him around the circuit. Zaustowicz was getting away at the front, pulling out a lead of 1.6 seconds after 5 laps as Carter set a new fastest lap to put him onto the back of Clark who had just lost out to Pender for 3rd. Zaustowicz improved on Carter's fastest lap with a 46.656 and extended his lead to 2 seconds as Pender put the pressure on Bennett with it paying off on the penultimate lap as he moved into 2nd ahead of Bennett. Zaustowicz was by now, 4 seconds up the road and took a comfortable win from Pender, Bennett, Clark and Carter.

Finals

Lights

Jake Butler made pole count as Joseph Conroy moved into 2nd from 3rd. Cameron Noble moved into 3rd with Max O'Shaughnessy into 4th. Tom Golding had moved into 5th with Joshua Craft behind him in 6th by the end of lap 1 with Conroy hitting the front on lap 2 and pulling a kart length. Noble, O'Shaughnessy and Golding were bottled up behind Butler, waiting to be released as Conroy began to string together some fastest laps to start building a lead. It took 4 laps, but Butler turned up his pace to set a new fastest lap, holding off Conroy's charge and taking some of the pressure off from behind. The pair both set 46.1's on the following lap with Conroy going 0.008 seconds quicker to take the new fastest lap. Golding outbraked Noble into turn 6 to take 3rd on lap 6 as Butler was the first driver to dip into the 45.9s. Butler continued to reel in Conroy at the front to get the gap down to half a second with Golding now starting to get away from Noble who had the young guns of Craft and O'Shaughnessy not far behind. Adam Blair was making steady progress to move into 6th ahead of O'Shaughnessy and onto the back of Craft and Noble as Conroy and Butler continued to match each other for pace with just a quarter of a second between them on lap 13. Despite Butler's best efforts, Conroy was placing his kart exactly where he needed to and was not succumbing to the pressure from Butler. Conroy took the win with Butler in 2nd setting a new fastest lap on the final lap. Golding completed the podium ahead of Noble and Blair.

Inters

Bobby Trundley held the lead with Luke Austin trying to go around the outside through turns 1 and 2. This allowed Lee Hollywood to sneak through into 2nd, dropping Austin to 3rd. Richard Lacey and Chris Alcock were into 4th and 5th respectively by the end of the first lap. The top 4 of Trundley, Hollywood, Austin and Lacey were making a break for it, leaving Alcock in a lonely 5th as he gapped David Cottrell and Giles Handley behind him. Hollywood set a new fastest lap on lap 4 and moved ahead of Trundley on lap 5 through turn 1. Trundley had to tuck in behind before Austin and Lacey could slip through with Lacey now taking the honours for fastest lap. Trundley was not going to let Hollywood take the win easily as he took his turn to apply the pressure, lapping within inches of the rear of Hollywood's kart. Lacey moved into 3rd on lap 6 and set another fastest lap on lap 7 to get right onto the back of the lead battle between Hollywood and Trundley as Austin lost some ground to the three in front. Trundley had to defend from Lacey on lap 9 through turn 3, leaving him on the back foot as they headed down the infield straight. This allowed Lacey to draw alongside on the run down to turn 4 with Lacey out-braking Trundley to take 2nd place and put Austin onto the back of Trundley's kart. A mistake at the same corner a lap later saw Trundley lose momentum and drop behind Austin and Alcock. This also gave Hollywood some breathing space with a 1.5 second lead over Lacey and Austin. Austin was pushing to close the half second to Lacey, setting a 45.946 to claim fastest lap and edge ever closer to Lacey. Lacey and Austin were gradually reeling Hollywood in, but were running out of time to do anything about it with 1 second between them as the 'last lap' board went out. Hollywood kept it under control to take the win from Lacey, Austin, Alcock and Trundley.
